




Getting to the Cherwell Centre 16 NORHAM GARDENS Oxford OX2 6QB

Magdalen Street Bus Stops


Arriving by car – use the **Oxford Parkway (previously known as Water Eaton) Park and Ride**. See reverse for details. There are no facilities for parking at the Cherwell Centre and the street parking is mostly restricted to residents' only parking which is vigorously enforced by Oxford's car parking wardens! There is some on-street parking but this is limited to 3 hours maximum stay.

Cherwell Centre 16 Norham Gardens

Arriving by train – the main railway station is about a mile and a quarter's walking distance (about 24 minutes) walk to the Cherwell Centre. For the **Oxford Parkway station** use the **Oxford Parkway Park and Ride** to get to the Centre

Arriving by coach - **Gloucester Green bus station** is just under a mile's walk, (about 18 minutes) walk to the Cherwell Centre

Arriving by bicycle – there are bicycle racks at The Cherwell Centre situated at the front of the property along the boundary between numbers 16 and 18 Norham Gardens (to your right as you face the Cherwell Centre building)

Park and Ride and other buses

Oxford Parkway (formerly know as Water Eaton) Park and Ride (OX2 8HA)

Norham Gardens is off Banbury Road on the route of the Oxford Parkway 500 Park and Ride bus service.

Buses run between the City Centre and Water Eaton every 15- 20 minutes from 07:26. The journey time is 10 -15 minutes.

The Park and Ride bus stops closest to Norham Gardens are Keble Road and St Margaret's Road.

Parking at Oxford Parkway will cost £2 for the day and the return fare is £2.80/£3.50.

Information correct at time of writing. Participants are advised to check timetable and fares.

Other Park and Ride Services

All Park and Ride routes serve the City Centre from which Norham Gardens is about a 25 minute walk or a short bus ride away.

Buses to and from the City Centre

Oxford Bus Company number 2 services

The bus stops in town for these routes are on Magdalen Street near the Odeon Cinema and the bus stop closest to Norham Gardens is Bevington Road.

On arrival.. Please go to the Conference Centre door of number 16 Norham Gardens. This is on your left as you face the front door of number 16. In the unlikely event that you, and not the trainer, are the first to arrive, please go to the front door of number 14 Norham Gardens.

FOOD and DRINK

OCTS courses have always been low-cost. One of the ways this has been achieved was by asking participants to provide their own lunch.

However, in response to feedback from participants lunch is now provided by the Restore Garden Café. The cost of lunch is included in the course fees.

Lunch will be delivered to the Cherwell Centre but it will not be laid out. In keeping with the spirit of OCTS it would be appreciated if participants would help to uncover the platters etc. Everything will be disposable so once again it would be appreciated if all used plates, cartons etc were put in the relevant bins provided. This will save the Sisters at the Cherwell Centre having too much extra work as a result of OCTS providing lunch for course participants.

There are facilities to make hot drinks at the Cherwell Centre throughout the day. Decaffeinated and regular tea and coffee and herbal teabags, milk, sugar, chilled water and biscuits are all provided.
